The World Bank began tracking poverty in China in 1981. In that year, 88.3 percent of China’s population lived on less than \$1.90 a day (roughly 870 million people). We see that the reduction of global poverty was very substantial even when we do not take into account the poverty reduction in China. In 1981 almost one third (29%) of the non-Chinese world population was living in extreme poverty.
